Pastor's Message July 2025

"The flowers appear in the earth: the time of the singing of birds is come, and the voice of the turtle is heard in our land" Song of Solomon 2:12



Following Pentecost and Trinity Sunday, our church calendar returns to what's known as "Ordinary Time". What an interesting way of refering to a time of recounting Jesus' ministry, the lives of the apostles and prophets, and the growth of the early church as recounted in the epistles. If anything, that sounds to me like an *extraordinary* time!

My understanding is that Ordinary Time, in this period after Easter and Pentecost, differs from other seasons in that there is no unifying theme Sunday to Sunday. Robert Webber writes in The Services of the Christian Year, from vol. 5 of The Complete Library of Christian Worship: "In Advent we await the coming of Christ;

during Christmas, we celebrate his arrival; and at Epiphany, we proclaim that Christ is manifested to the world as Savior. During Lent, we prepare for the death; in Holy Week, we re-enact his death; then in Easter, we celebrate his resurrection and complete the Easter cycle with the celebration of the coming of the Holy Spirit. But in the nonfestive season of the church year, there is no unified theme that ties the Sundays together."

Accepting the thematic looseness of the time, we still may make this a festive season: this is the time of year that the Song of Solomon notes for its profusion of flowers and birdsong. God's colouring book is vivid here in July and August, as gardens are in full bloom and the sunlight seems at its brightest. God makes each day on God's earth truly beyond ordinary. This is a great time to take Jesus' advice as reported in Matthew 6:28, and "consider the lillies of the field, how they grow".

As many folks spend more time on the road for vacation, attend Independence Day parades and family functions, have more time outdoors in the warm weather enjoying, literally, the fruits of creation, the wonder of God's creativity is astounding. I hope you are able to experience the pleasure of the summer, especially getting a chance to enjoy our Green on Main! We'll serve lemonade and cookies for the Street Fair on July 12th, giving us a chance to meet, greet, and encourage others to make use of the space. May we make this season most un-ordinary.
