Pastor's Message August 2025

"...Now faith is the confidence of things hoped for, and the evidence of things not seen. For by it our elders were given a good report. Through faith, we understand that the world was ordained by the Word of God, so that the things which we see are not made of things which are visible..."

Hebrews 11:1-3



The rainbow pictured appeared just a few days ago, as we travelled to visit a loved one in hospital. Remembering the symbolism of the bow from Genesis 9 ("...the bow shall be in the cloud, so that I may see it and remember the everlasting Covenant between God and every living thing, in all flesh that is upon the Earth."), I was reminded of God's covenant, God's care for us made visible, and the hopeful sense this was "a good sign". In short, it gave "confidence of things hoped for".

The letter to the Hebrews, parts of which we'll be hearing each Sunday in August, contains exhortations

to help us, now as then, keep faith on our journey together. The power of faith, and its ability to lift us beyond our doubts and hesitations, runs as a theme through the letter. That confidence of things hoped for and evidence of things not seen were crucial to the emerging church, and remain so today. Farmers and gardeners, in songwriter Stan Rogers' words, "Put another season's promise in the ground" back in spring with the hope of the harvests we see now. Individuals look to God through prayer in both good times and bad. Churches strive to improve in the performance of our missions, with faith that God will show us the best path forward.

Here in August, in the height of summer, it's easy to find the visible evidence of God's *invisible* handiwork: flowers are in bloom, farm stands have local sweet corn, hay is ready for another cutting. For many people, it's a month for a vacation trip and seeing the beauty of other places. Again, we are viewing visible *the evidence of things not seen*. Let's imagine just how much more God has to show us! Through our faith, God's greatness may come to be visible to all. As the letter to the Hebrews encourages, "*let us run with patience the race that is set before us*".

The next "Acoustic Worship" sing-along will be on Wednesday, August 6th. Come to enjoy a time of music in praise of God. There will be old favorites and some surprises, all easily singable. Hoping to see you then!


