Christmas Food Festival Was A Success

Polly Blais and Carol Richardson organized the first ever Christmas Food Festival held in the Vestry on December 20th. There were 7 Vendors who paid for the table space and then sold their Food. All were happy with their results, including our own Church Food Table which took in \$276., in addition to the \$155. received in table rental. Thanks to everyone who baked and helped. 802 Soul Foods rented the kitchen to sell take-out dinners and will be back doing the same thing on Friday, January 16th from 5-8 PM.

The Christmas Eve Service was well attended and the generous offering of \$347. was divided between Habitat for Humanity and the VT UCC Hope Fund. The week before was the annual Christmas Fund offering with \$50. received and sent to the VT UCC.

Community Lunches are on hold until we find a new Coordinator. Pat Townsend has been organizing these meals since March 2024 and she is stepping down from this task. There are lots of volunteers who will help on that day, and instructions to follow that Diane Holme originally set up, but we need a new person to organize the monthly menus and volunteers!

Special Congregational Meeting on 10/26 and meeting with Mike Schmitt on 11/9.

The meeting on 10/26 was well attended. Pastor Michael will be retiring at the end of this year. He has offered to continue as a Bridge Pastor until we find a new Pastor. A Search Committee was formed. We had a conversation about renting space in our church to community groups as a result of our Leadership Council recommending that we speak with Mike Schmitt, President of the Springfield Chamber of Commerce. Mike had some thoughts about possibilities. The members on 10/26 asked that Mike meet with us to share these ideas and for us to explore this opportunity.

Members and friends were invited to meet with Mike after worship on 11/9. Mike spoke about three groups looking for space for their collections and for classroom/lecture space. The groups mentioned were the Springfield Historical Society, Stellafane and the Vault. Mike said that a "management committee" could be formed from the community and likely at least one church member to find funding/grants for any structural changes needed and would oversee the process of re-imagining our church building. Church members were concerned about how all of this would work and still have Sunday services and an ongoing faith community. Mike also mentioned the idea of a Culinary Institute and another member mentioned earlier the possibility of a Music Academy. The next step may be to ask Vanessa Rebentisch, Director, of Springfield on the Move to speak with us. Members also wanted more information about how the three groups needing room for their collection would use our available space. Members had questions about how the second floor classrooms could work. There are lots of good questions and a lot of possibilities. What can we give up to make this large, beautiful building fit into supporting the revitalization of Springfield?
